Who We Are

We are one small part of the Body of Christ, called to a life of loving and doing God's will; ordinary, imperfect people facing the turbulence of these times together.

We were born out of the Church of the Saviour in Washington, DC in 1976. The life of Seekers Church is based on the belief that God calls each person to minister to some place of need in God's Creation.

We are called to journey together with Christ, an adventure that includes...

- † **An *Inner Journey* to a deeper faith in God**, nourishing ourselves through daily spiritual practices ... spiritual accountability within the community ... classes for children, youth and adults ... a weekend of silent retreat at least once every year.
- † **An *Outer Journey* to serve God's Creation** through personal commitment in daily life, as well as through action taken together in small groups where we work in response to God's call.
- † **A *Community Journey* to nurture the Body of Christ** celebrating our rich and diverse faith traditions ... sharing leadership and ministry widely ... including children in all we do together ... welcoming people of all ages, races, and sexual or gender orientations.

The call to love and serve God's Creation may take root in workplace, community or family. It is likely to seem too big for us, but as we deepen our commitment to Christ and find support from each other, our faith deepens, and we can dare to say "Yes" to God's call to commitment.
