#### **Current Level of Outside Support**

As a nonprofit, DreamHost provides Seekers free basic webhosting. In addition, Seeker pays for something called DreamPress, which gives us free domain registration, unmetered bandwidth, 60GB storage, and regular backups. This is billed at \$239.88/year, and will renew on May 27, 2024

### Physical Checkup/Immunizations/Well Baby

Basic DreamCare service at \$59/month, which includes the following things which need to be done but are beyond the skills of the current Seekers:

Dreamhost does the technical work, either as:  A. billed on an as-needed basis at \$129/hour,  B. a flat rate of \$300/month for 3 hours of such development work each month. This level of support also includes offsite cloud backups and immediate repair if the site is hacked.

#### Current website challenge and recommendation:

The Seekers secured section (log in area) only contains the Stewards minutes at this point. There is a level of effort involved in maintaining this portion of the website (confirming access, giving instructions on logging in, etc.).

Recommend discontinuing the secured area and share the minutes via email with all on the Seekers email list. There would still need to be a location for the archive of the minutes.
